Natural and nature-based green infrastructure practices can play a critical role in making New Hampshire's coastal communities more resilient to natural hazards. In this introductory course, fundamental concepts and practices will be reviewed and local speakers will share lessons learned from specific projects and programs.

- Differentiate green infrastructure terms and concepts
- Identify the ecological, economic, and societal benefits of green infrastructure
- Recognize the wide variety of scales of approaches referred to as green infrastructure
- Identify new or existing planning processes suitable for integrating green infrastructure techniques
- Connect with local green infrastructure activities and experts

**Target Audiences:** Local municipal staff and officials (planners, DPW staff, board members, etc.), hazard mitigation, stormwater management, and floodplain management practitioners, natural resource managers, and others working on coastal resilience issues.
